Nursing Workforce

Oregon Legislation Updates: State lawmakers returned to work following the Oregon Senate's historic walkout. Numerous bills are making their way to approval, including <u>House Bill 2697</u>, related to nurse staffing, which was passed late on Thursday, June 22. We will have confirmation on the status of all bills next week, as Sunday, June 25, marks Sine Die.

Nursing Strikes: As Providence nurses <u>enter the fifth day of their strike</u>, Huddlers recognized how heartbreaking moments like these can be for our nursing community. Many Huddlers have friends and colleagues on both sides of the argument—from the picket line to the administrative teams. We also discussed educating student nurses on union representation and negotiation. These moments create opportunities to drive change in our nursing workforce with a focus on retention and culture.

Coaching and Mentoring: We discussed the role of mentoring and coaching in the nursing workplace, from the positive impact on newly graduated nurses to an organization's leadership. Huddlers pointed out that these programs require infrastructure but should also become an embedded part of organizational culture— a necessary duality in the workplace. OSBN Board Meeting: The Oregon State Board of Nursing hosted a two-day board meeting this week, which included numerous updates to rules, regulations, and upcoming RAC opportunities. Updated COVID-19 Vaccination for Fall: The FDA's advisory committee (VRBPAC) is pushing Pfizer, Moderna, and Novavax to create <u>an updated COVID-19 vaccine</u> ready for fall. The requested vaccine would be a monovalent vaccine that targets only the XBB.1.5 Omicron subvariant.
