Nursing Workforce

PeaceHealth Closure in Eugene: Huddlers discussed how the <u>closure of PeaceHealth's University</u> <u>District campus</u>, located near the University of Oregon, will impact the local community and healthcare workers. Low admission rates and high costs are cited as reasons for the closure. One Huddler pointed out that the news is indicative of the current state of healthcare as a business, as we see more facilities merging and closing due to financial reasons. Another attendee pointed out that a lack of trust between leadership and front-line staff hinders the conversations around finances and business.
