Nursing Workforce

Legislative Days: Government leaders <u>have convened in Salem for a short session</u>. According to Representative Travis Nelson, Measure 110, The Basic Health Plan, and mergers and acquisitions are on the agenda. Other bills address scheduling transparency for healthcare workers, mandated hospital finance reporting, and more.

Nursing Education

Competency-Based Learning for Students and New Grads: Huddlers dove deep into nursing competencies and bridging the gap between the classroom and clinical practice. The <u>AACN</u> <u>Essentials</u> outline core competencies that nursing school curriculums should address. Huddlers in education, such as the University of Portland, discussed their ongoing efforts to meet these standards. However, Huddlers agreed that a well-rounded nursing education goes beyond essential clinical skills. Skills like critical thinking, advocacy, and communication are also crucial. Some recent graduates struggle with these soft skills, potentially due to the COVID-19 pandemic's effect on education and online learning. Huddlers working with new graduates in clinical settings also chimed in, discussing the investment many facilities make in their onsite Skill Labs to help bridge the gap for recent graduates and build their confidence during the transition to practice. We also identified the <u>importance of psychological safety</u> in both the classroom and clinical learning environments, as it allows students to speak up and ask for help when needed.
