Nursing Workforce

NurseLearn Program Expansion: Huddlers heard from the <u>NurseLearn</u> team about their *Schools of Nursing* project. NurseLearn aims to bolster the nursing workforce by delivering education programs to retain, recruit, and support nurses in community-based care (CBC). Through NurseLearn's Schools of Nursing project, NurseLearn works directly with nursing educators and program directors across the state to strengthen educational pathways into CBC fields by expanding nursing curricula to include CBC content and residency opportunities. Nursing Education

New Graduates and Advanced Practice Nursing: We discussed an emerging trend in the California nursing workforce, which suggests that 30 percent of new graduates are leaving bedside roles to <u>pursue work as nurse practitioners (NP)</u>. Huddlers agreed that the trend might look different in Oregon. Instead, it is not uncommon to see students entering into their nursing education with a decided plan to become an NP. For example, George Fox estimates that 10-20 percent of graduating seniors plan to pursue advanced practice. OSBN also reported an anecdotal increase in NP licensure applications and clinical placements.

The State of Graduate-Level Nursing Programs: Huddlers also explored the role of graduate-level education in the nursing profession, such as a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN). We discussed the limited number of Oregon-based graduate-level nursing programs. One Huddler pointed out that numerous Oregon-based MSN programs have been phased out in recent years due to low enrollment. Meanwhile, out-of-state MSN programs are gaining popularity amongst Oregon nurses due to the convenience of remote, asynchronous learning and competitive pricing.
