Nursing Workforce

Updated COVID Vaccine FAQs: The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) published an updated resource to answer some of the most common questions about the 2024-2025 coronavirus vaccination. This patient-friendly FAQ <u>document is available online</u>.

Oregon Geriatric Workforce Enhancement Program (GWEP): The education-focused GWEP program aims to educate and train Oregon's healthcare workforce to provide age-friendly and dementia-friendly care for older adults. Nursing Education

Expanding Clinical Placements for Nursing Students: Huddlers discussed how we can address the growing challenges of securing clinical placements for undergraduate nursing students, especially as new education programs are established. Attendees in nursing education pointed out that limited availability for placements continues to be a barrier for Oregon's nursing programs. Faculty are also challenged to supervise students who are split across numerous units and buildings of a clinical site. Similarly, healthcare systems emphasize their desire to provide placement opportunities but cite limited staffing and a shortage of nursing school faculty to support and supervise students while on site adequately. Some facilities have explored hiring educated clinical education staff to help support student cohorts during on-site learning. Huddlers also explored the telepresence-based oversight model, where nursing faculty would be available to students through virtual platforms like video calls. This model of virtual preceptorship is already being piloted in other states, but concerns about patient privacy and HIPAA compliance still exist. Healthcare systems are already looking at ways to implement virtual nursing solutions in acute care settings.
