Nursing Workforce

Order Free At-Home COVID Tests: This fall season, residential households can order additional free at-home COVID test kits. Each household will receive four rapid antigen tests with free shipping. <u>Tests can now be ordered online through USPS</u>.

Free RN Delegation Courses: NurseLearn recently added four new online courses addressing delegation for registered nurses in Oregon. These courses are free online, along with 26 other courses tailored to community-based care nursing. Exploring the Nursing Vacancy Crisis: Inspired by a presentation that OCN gave at this week's Rural Health Conference in Bend, Oregon, Huddlers discussed the factors contributing to a continued nurse vacancy crisis despite an unprecedented number of licensed professionals in the state. OCN's ongoing research underscores the importance of a healthy workplace and work-life balance and employees feeling respected and appreciated. <u>Workplace embeddedness</u> has become even more critical since the COVID-19 pandemic. Huddlers also agreed there is widespread distrust in healthcare system leadership. Some organizations attempt to address these issues through open office hours and 1:1 meetings to create a dialogue between leadership and staff. The inability to provide safe patient care can also influence a nurse's decision to leave a position. Examples included increasingly high patient acuity, unrealistic workload expectations, and time-bound patient interactions. Finally, Huddlers agreed that systemic change is necessary rather than shaming employees for "not doing enough."
