The estimated number of registered nurses (RNs) currently work in Oregon:









Approximately 14% of the registered nurse workforce in Oregon is male.


This is higher than the 11% U.S. national average, according to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing 2022 National Nursing Workforce Survey.

The median age of an Oregon nurse is 42. More than 50% of Oregon's nurses are between the ages of 20 and 43.



Approximately 76% of Oregon's nurses identifies as white.
